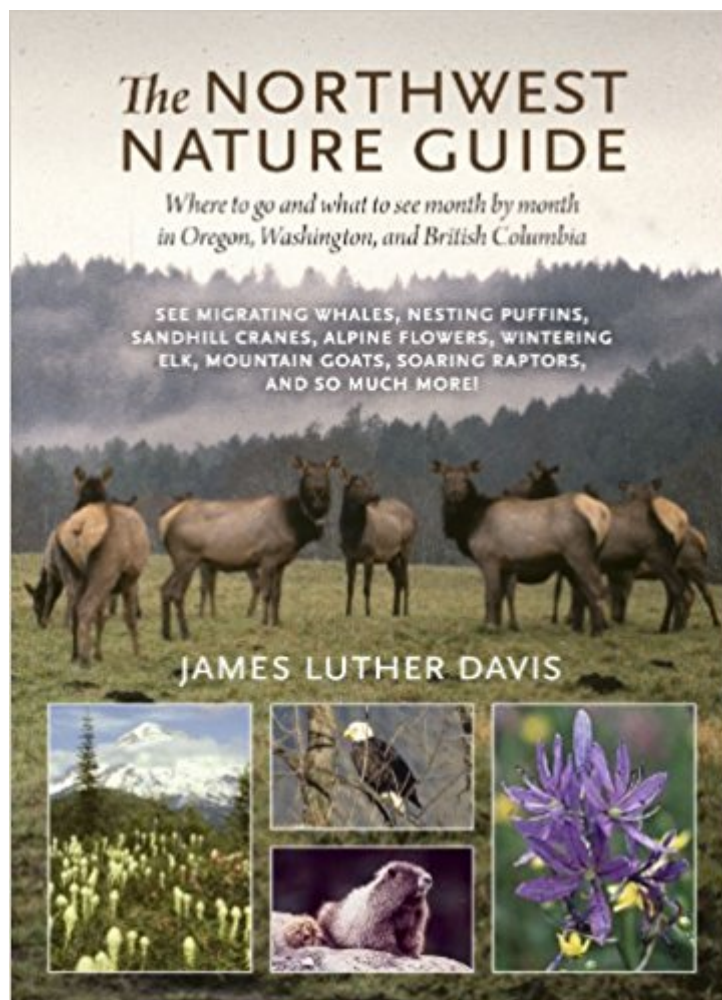


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# The Northwest Nature Guide: Where To Go And What To See Month By Month In Oregon, Washington, And British Columbia

He grew up chasing lizards in the Sonoran Desert, going on to earn a master's degree in zoology from Colorado State University. He taught at Marylhurst University where he helped start the Head Start Summer Science Institute. During this time he wrote this book's predecessor, Seasonal Guide to the Natural Year: Oregon,

Washington, and British Columbia (1996). He also contributed to *Wild in the City: A Guide to Portland's Natural Areas*. Davis and his wife, Sally, live in Portland. When not pursuing his natural history interests, he plays guitar in rock and roll bands, although not nearly enough these days.
