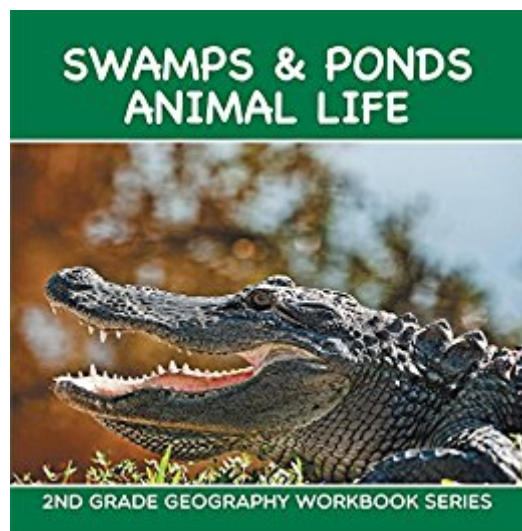

Here is my review for this book: I am a mother of three kids who love to learn. I am always so very excited to find a new book with some information that I think that they might love. Right from the cover I knew this was going to be a good workbook for them. My two boys love alligators, and frogs. Learning all about them and their habit, I knew was going to be a lot of fun. We have recently been reading a lot of books written by Baby Professor. The only

complaint I have is that I think that some of her vocabulary is to advance for kids. As for this being a workbook it is not. Really it is more of a book than a workbook. I was expecting to have questions or even little activities for us to do but sadly there was not. We still really did love this book, but I think calling it a workbook is very misleading. The book is eighteen pages and really is an introduction to a few animals that call swamps and ponds there home. The illustrations are great but some are missing some information about them. It would have been nice to see some information that went with all of the pictures. I will say the pictures are really captivating. It's a great way to catch the reader's attention it's a shame that not all pictures have information on them. I think that it would have added to the pictures. On a positive note my children all stayed very interested in the book they were able to learn the key points the books present and are able to retain the information. The book is very educational, and had some very interesting facts. Overall I would highly recommend this book, but I only gave it 3 stars as the book claims to be a workbook and it is definitely not one. I just received this book Swamps and Ponds Animal Life. I have received a couple other books by the same maker that I was super impressed with and absolutely loved. Unfortunately I can not put this book on the same level. Here are my thoughts after reading through the book. Pros: There are

bright beautiful photos throughout the whole book. You receive a couple of facts about each animal/bug Short enough and bright enough to keep a small child's attention Good for reading ages 6-9Cons: There are only 7 different animals or bugs covered in the book. There is a page with a photo and then a small description and then when you turn the page of the book, there is a full photo of that animal on the next two pages. So you get nice beautiful photos but unfortunately only on 7 different animals. You really do not learn very much about each animal or how that animal impacts the swamp and pond life.I received this book for free in exchange for my honest and unbiased opinion. I only gave this book a three out of five stars for a couple of reasons. First, I was very disappointed to only have seven animals/bugs covered in the book. Based off of their other books I expected this to still work for a older elementary child and I feel like that is really a stretch. But it was not all bad because the photos are bright and beautiful and fun to look at. My little ones will enjoy look at the photos.

When I saw Swamps and Ponds second grade geography workbook series I just had to grab a copy and read it. The word workbook led me to believe this may be an interactive book that my students could write in or alongside of. The picture on the alligator is an attention grabber and made it so I could hardly wait to share this book with my students.First of all, I need to point out that this book isn't actually a workbook at all. However, once I started reading I got over that oversight fairly quickly. This book is a good introduction to different types of animals one would find in swamps and ponds. Each animal has about 4 pages dedicated to it, with this being approximately seventy five percent pictures and twenty five percent words. I liked that each animal had more than one photograph dedicated to its page since my students and most other children I know really enjoy getting to see different pictures of animals. I felt that some of the animals the children and I would be familiar with - such as alligators, but there are also opportunities to learn about new animals you may not have seen before. The alligator gar is one such animal listed in this book.If you have a second grader I recommend adding this book to your e library.I was offered this book at a discount in exchange for an honest review.

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
