

The other thing I like about this book is that it teaches kids about the justice system and about our government. There are info boxes and vocabulary words sprinkled throughout the book. It's a good read for a kid that enjoys nonfiction, or anyone interested in learning more about judges and government.

It is filled with a vast amount of photos and illustrations with captions on each, explaining that particular picture. It will assist in widely developing a child's understanding and vocabulary. To further aid in education, it has a quiz at the end of the forty three pages of insight then an additional glossary at the end.
