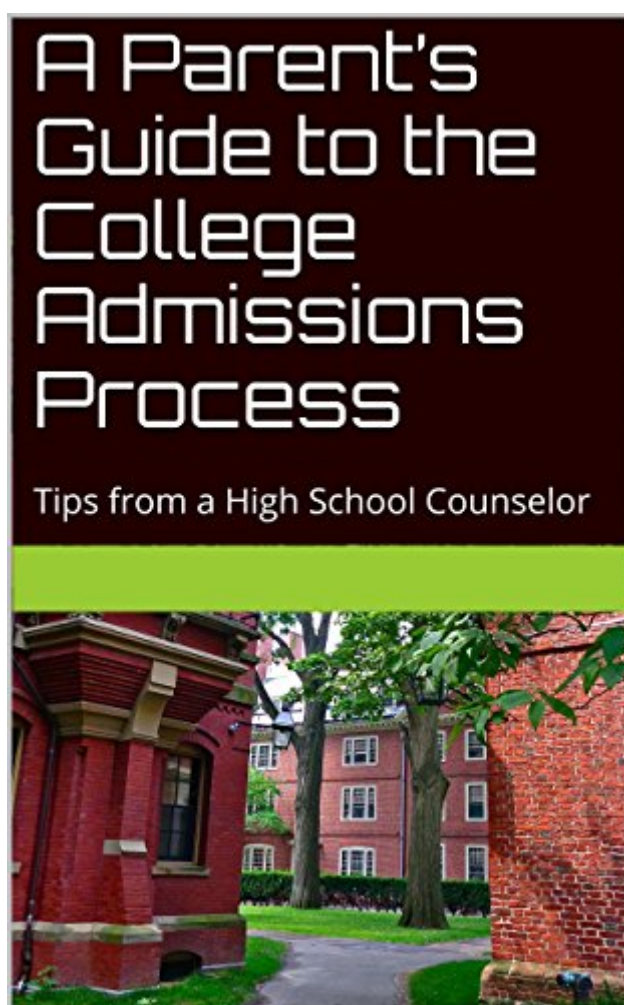


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# A Parent's Guide To The College Admissions Process: Tips From A High School Counselor
