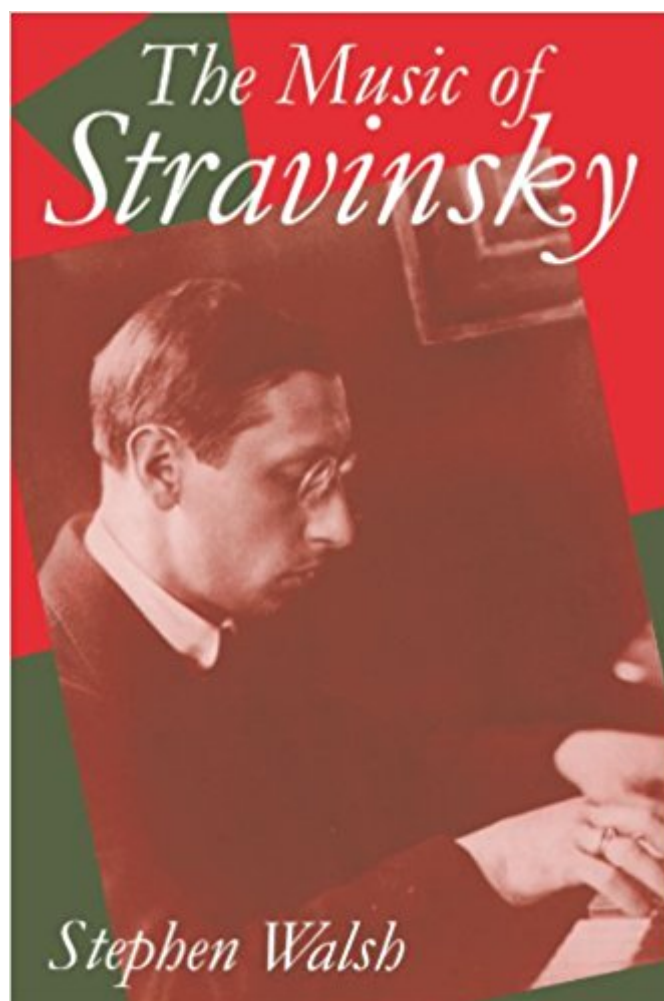


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The Music Of Stravinsky (Clarendon Paperbacks)
